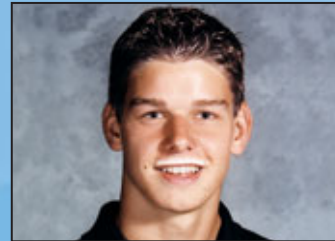
America's Dairy Farmers and Milk Processors salute these outstanding scholar athletes and look forward to introducing the SAMMY 2003 winners next year.

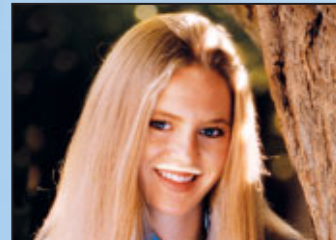
